## Year 2



## English:

We begin this half term looking at instructions focussing on how to follow and write them after receiving a letter from a local farmer asking for some advice!

We will also be looking at the classic story 'The Kapok tree.' Our focus will be on orally retelling this story-using story telling actions. Once we know this story well we will be using our innovation skills to change and write our own story based upon this theme. In our grammar, we will be focussing on the use of various punctuation such as exclamation marks, commas and full stops.. Our word level work sees us spotting the suffixes – ed, -ing, -er and -est onto root words where there are additional no spelling rules.

Within our reading we will be looking at: a story from another culture in Mama Panya's Pancakes; Alice in Wonderland, which will link to our World Book Day theme.

<u>Science</u>: Get your gardening gloves at the ready! Our science learning sees us continuing with our Nature Journal work linked to our school ground. During this unit we look at being able to: identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees; and identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.

We are also hoping to have a visit to a plant nursery to see how the process works
