Endeavour Class: Sasha: Spelling Star – working hard and with enthusiasm to master the Year 7

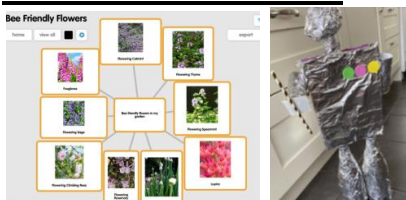
spelling bank preview in her working from home pack.
