Online Safety:

Key Stage 1: We talked about what we liked doing on our tablets/ipads/phones. We like playing Obb and Bob (phonics play), going on YouTube, practising words, playing games, seeing each other on daily Zooms and school work #JanuaryLockdown. We listened to a story of Smartie the penguin. Then

we talked about what to do if we saw things which we weren't expecting on our devices. We were superstars and knew that we should tell a grown-up we TRUST. The children were so confident at sharing their advice.



Atlantis: On Safer Internet day we looked at "trust". We discussed what trust means and looked at different synonyms' for trust. We then listened to an amazing story about researching online and how sometimes the information on the internet can be put there to try and trick us and we need to broaden our research and look at alternative ways to find information out.



Enterprise: For internet safety Enterprise class explored who we can trust online. We know it is easy to see who to trust in real life but online it becomes tricky and we need clues to help us. We learnt tips to help us be E-Safety Sleuths before using these skills to help Miss Topping decide if an iPad advert was too good to be true!

Endeavour: George-'We learnt that anyone who posts online always has a motive. This motive could be innocent or could be with intent. We learnt all about key terms for hidden online selling that we might see in the Tiktoks or YouTube videos we watch. We learnt to always ask what the motive of the post is before we comment or act.
