Honey Bees and Discovery: Mrs Lever shared her favourite childhood story - 'Funnybones' and the children shared their favourite stories too. We did a 'Guess the Story' quiz and enjoyed seeing each other as some of us had dressed up! We had a BFG, an Elsa, Marshall from Paw Patrol, an alien, Spiderman and Mrs Lever was a skeleton! After our Zoom we did some super Funnybones sentences and our own illustration for the book. Finally, we made our own skeletons using cotton buds! Such a busy day.

Atlantis: For World Book Day this year, we looked at how reading can bring us happiness. We all brought our favourite book to zoom and school, we talked about why this book makes us happy and discussed our favourite parts. We then designed a persuasive poster to get somebody to read our books. We then had a listen to Mr Pitcher's 'happiness' book Superworm, we looked at the two main characters and completed a character profile on them focusing on their appearance and personality. We then went on a scavenger hunt looking for different animals, objects, people and creatures in our class library.

When we had found these, we had to note down the book and the page number onto our scavenger sheet.

Enterprise: Enterprise have been looking at The Secret Garden. The children have designed their own world they would like to visit when they escape through the door. They also created robin artwork and design their doorway

Endeavour: This year we used the book Inside Out and Back Again to explore our theme of happiness. Although this real life recount about evacuating from the Vietnam War was sad, we learnt how our character used her happy place to build resilience. We also learnt how important it is to take time to check in with others and consider how well we know those around us and their struggles.
