Discovery: Working on our zigzag books for writing week.

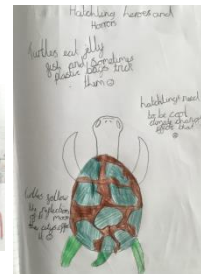
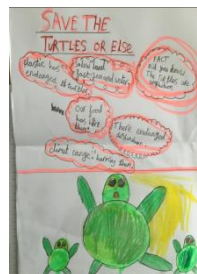
Atlantis: This week in writing week, we watched the video and discussed what was happening. We looked at how we can use descriptive language to set the scene and help the reader

imagine what is happening. In the afternoon we discussed sea turtles and the hardships and pollution and designed persuasive posters to stop sea pollution.



Enterprise: This week Hoole St Michael have been writing fiction. All the children writing has been based around a clip "Once in a lifetime".

Enterprise: In Enterprise, we focus on the animals in the clip, the turtles. We explored how these animals are endangered and some species are at risk of extinction. We have been revisiting science vocabulary from habitats and food chains to understand the risks posed to these animals and add that to our writing.



Endeavour: Writing Week – exploring airships and the work of Roald Amundsen in the Arctic.

Investigating the first Zeppelin crash in 1915 and linking to World War 1.



Discovery: Phonics game 'What's the word Mr Wolf!?'

Atlantis: Using the video as inspiration for our writing week, we got into role as the characters on the airships and discussed our thoughts and feelings when he saw the huge turtles flying through the sky.
