Honey Bees and Discovery: We read the story-Sulwe wants to be beautiful and bright. We went on our own magical journey to see our own unique beauty and realised how special we all are.

Atlantis: We looked at Usain Bolt this week. We watched videos so we could see what he was like and read some facts about him. We spoke about how skin colour (or any other difference) doesn't change who you are as a person or what you can achieve if you work hard. We then thought of adjectives to describe him like powerful, energetic and speedy! After that we learnt what a simile is and used our knowledge of Bolt to write our own similes such as 'Usain Bolt is as powerful as a bear.' Finally, we wrote these similes in a poem and performed them to the class.

We have learnt all about a man named John Blanke who was a royal trumpeter during the reign of Henry VII and Henry VIII. We have written biographies about him detailing all we know about his life. We have also looked at Martin Luther King. We have compared him to David from the Bible and thought about how we think he would feel looking at the current news events linked to racism and the black community.

Endeavour: Black History Month. We have been reading Windrush Child by Benjamin Zephaniah. We

have created TV news reports in drama and wrote postcards and letters in role. We have learnt all about Jamaica and the other islands of the Caribbean.
