English: Active Learners Classic Generation

Maths: Confidence, Bold, Active Leaners

We will begin our year with a focus on place value and counting. Using Maths No Problem as our lead, Year 5 will be counting, ordering and comparing numbers to one million. Year 6 will doing exactly the same within ten million. We will also be rounding numbers to the nearest ten, hundred and thousand. Using rounding as a key to checking our calculations, we will then move on to addition and subtraction.

Science: Active Learners Partnerships Knowledge

This half term is all about light. Our key vocabulary will be light rays and straight lines. We will be exploring how we see in the first place, before moving on to how key inventions work, such as the rear view mirror and periscopes. We will work to prove that light travels in straight lines, sending light beams through different sized holes. Finally, we will take on a shadow formation investigation.





Reading
