Active April:



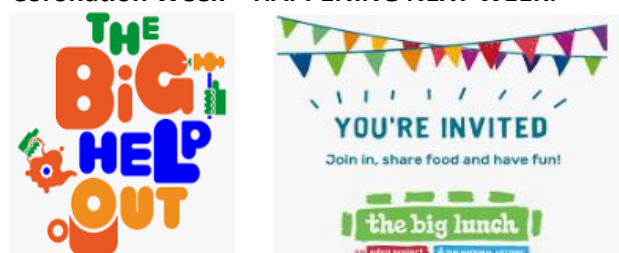
Honey Bees and Discovery – We have been going exploring and noticing new things.
