Enterprise- We have been focused on the good things that you take for granted.

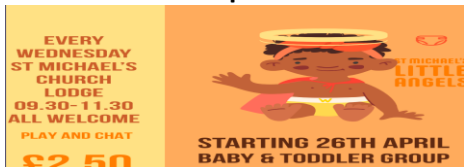
Endeavour- Our focus this week has been noticing those little things that make us happy.
