


We will be starting the year with the **building blocks of maths** - the value of number. Moving on, we will be **cementing and applying** our skills with number through addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. In our daily fluency sessions, we will be focusing on these three key words: **flexibility, accuracy and efficiency**, with a theme of number.

Science: Active Learners Knowledge Partnerships

Science this half term is all about evolution and inheritance. We will begin by looking at the adaptations that species make to be able to live successfully in their habitat. We will **then research** different breeds of dog and have a try at designing our own working dog to fit a specific criteria.




Reading
