Should music be part of every school day?

21st April 2025



Following Ed Sheeran's letter to the government about school funding for music education, this pack focused on the impact of music within the school day. Children discussed their own experience with music, and thought about how we can use our voices to make a change.

28th April 2025



Bin worker strikes have been ongoing in Birmingham, so this pack thought about the role we all play within our communities. Children reflected on the strike, reasons for striking, and celebrated the contributions made by important workers to our communities.

This month marks the 80th anniversary of VE Day. The Special Pack covered the meaning of VE Day and the change it signified. The pack also highlighted VE Day celebrations, what life was like during WWII, and the importance of peace today.

Three teenagers from India have been entered in The Earth Prize for their innovation – a fridge that doesn't require electricity to transport medication in remote areas. This inspired children's conversations around invention and inclusivity, considering how we can adapt items to support others.

3 tips for teaching the news

Start in the morning

Talking about the news in the morning means children have plenty of time to share any further questions, concerns or ideas with you throughout the day about what they've learned. It also creates more opportunities to reflect on or link to the topics you've encountered together!

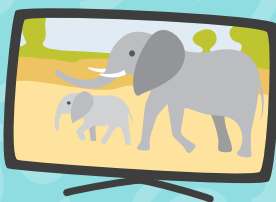


Make it child-led

Following children's lead within news-based learning lets them uncover new interests, opinions and ideas as they relate to what's happening and explore further. You might also like to involve children in running assemblies or discussions about the news – from planning to presenting!

Focus on images

Focusing on imagery related to topical events, alongside written articles or broadcast reports, can make what's happening in the world more accessible and child-friendly. Images offer helpful visual context for children to comprehend events, providing an engaging stimulus for conversations, thoughts and reflection.
