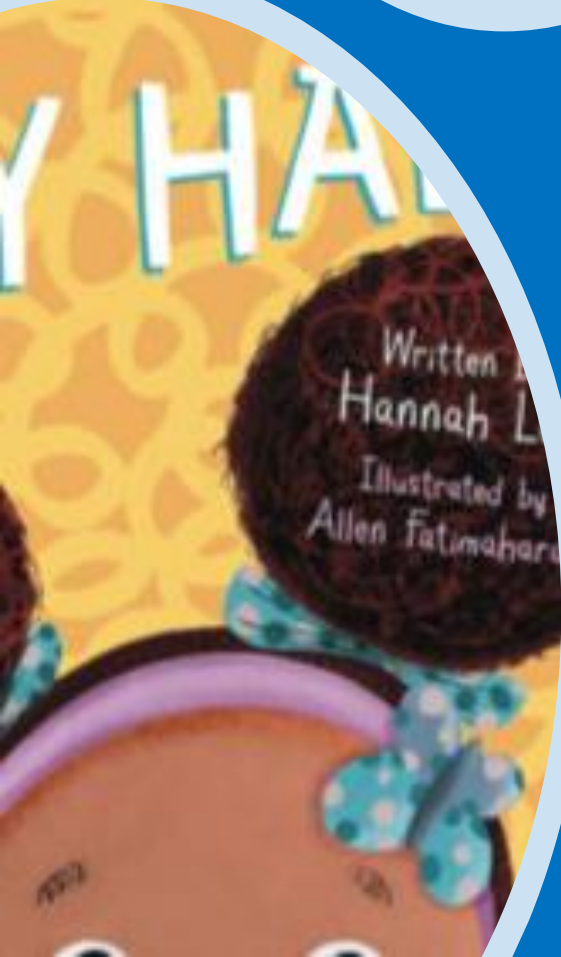


Phonics

Maths:

We will be building our **confidence** and **thirst for knowledge** by exploring matching and patterns. We will be learning all about how to identify objects that match and developing this knowledge into pattern building.

Phonics - confidence and active learners- During this half term, children will begin to find, recognise and write their own names. They will also look at identifying some of the letters within their names. Phonics games will be in the provision with a focus on hearing initial sounds, segmenting and blending. Children will take home individual reading books, sounds and tricky words. Children will draw/make meaningful marks of themselves, family, home, bodies and animals.

Phase 1 phonics - rhyming, alliteration, initial sounds, segmenting and blend.

Phase 2 phonics - s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, b, g, o, c, k

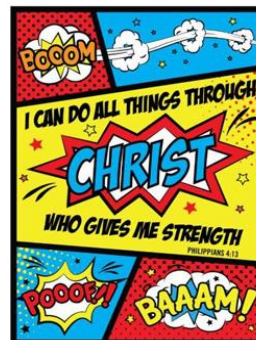

Communication and Language -

We will be providing lots of opportunities for the children to develop their listening skills helping them to understand why listening is important. This will be done through whole class sharing of stories linked to our themes of 'The Gingerbread Man', 'I'm Special', 'Colours' and our learning in maths. We will spend time building the children's confidence, courage and resilience during our Guided Reading Sessions using the John Murray approach. We are also going to spending time thinking about ourselves, our friends and our families taking time to listen to the views of others (linked to PSED)

Physical Development- confidence, partnership, strong relationships:

During this half term, we focus on developing the core strengths to enable your child to develop both gross motor and fine motor skills. This will be done through co-operative play, woodland sessions, learning through play outdoors along with fine motor skills activities.

Geography/History:

In Geography, we are looking at our world. We will be using maps to build our **confidence** in our **knowledge** of the Seven Continents, the Equator, the North and South Pole and their locations. Maths:

English: Confidence Partnership Growth mindset

This half term, Year 1/2 will be diving into the exciting story of The Troll Swap. We will explore the characters, settings and events in the story, making predictions and discussing how the characters feel. The children will have opportunities to write descriptions, create their own sentences and retell parts of the story using adventurous vocabulary. We will also focus on developing sentence structure, punctuation, spelling and handwriting skills, while encouraging the children to become confident and imaginative writers.

PE, Forest School and Homework

PE:

Our PE day for Discovery is a Tuesday, Atlantis have PE on Tuesday and Friday. Children will need to come to school in PE kit on their PE day.

Forest School:

Forest School is on a Friday for Discovery and a Wednesday for Atlantis. On this day children also come to school in their PE kit. They should have wellies and Puddlesuits/Forest School clothes in their locker to layer over the top of their kit.

Homework:

EYFS: Once the children begin phonics they will get weekly spellings linked to their phonics sounds. This will be 5 words to begin with but will increase to 10 throughout the year and ready for Year 1.

Atlantis: Spellings, Numbots/TTRS

Reading Books

Children will bring home two reading books. A colour book band (that they will need support with) and a phonics book.

Their phonics book is linked to their learning. It will only contain sounds that we have learnt in school and it sent home for the children to practise applying their new learning and build their confidence in reading.

Their colour book band book may contain tricky words or sounds they have not come across and is a book for you to share together and expose them to new vocabulary and discussions around books at home.
